Reminder to please cancel any pre-ordered lunches if your child is not attending school that day.

Morning drop-off:

The school gates will be open from 8.35am, with leaders welcoming the children at the gates. The register will be taken at 8.45am and all children will be expected to be settled in class by this time. Lessons will start promptly at 8.50am.

Year 1, 2, 3 and 6 children enter via the side gate (opposite the play park) Nursery, Reception, Year 4 and Year 5 children enter via the front gate.

Reception parents will be invited to drop the children off at the classroom door via the reception garden.

After-school pick-up:

The school day will end at 3.15pm and parents are asked to pick children up from the outside classroom doors.

Beach Club After-school Childcare Provision:

The after-school Beach Club provision will operate from 3.15pm to 5.15pm from September 2023.

Overdue Books

Overdue lists are sent out on a weekly basis to class teachers for them to advise individual children that they have an overdue book/s. These lists are followed up by letters which are sent home. Failure to return overdue books has a detrimental effect on the choice in the library and on the library budget. If your child receives a letter advising of an overdue book/s please complete the letter appropriately and return it to the school. Please email the library should you need any assistance.

The National Trust and other organisations are holding treasure hunts and other Easter related activities, some free or a small donation would be welcome. The staff at Carterton Library will offer a warm welcome should you wish to visit. 
